Stephen Igor Warokka graduated from the Faculty of Law at Atma Jaya University in 2007 before joining SSEK as part of its internship program.

He met with foreign business chambers in Jakarta to help coordinate their input on the draft decree, helped prepare and amend letters from the business chambers to the Ministry of Manpower (MOM), and met with the MOM, the Vice President's Office and the Coordinating Ministry for Maritime Affairs.

Stephen's experience also includes representation of various foreign shipping companies in the acquisition and sale of vessels; advising a foreign shipping company on the shipping agency business in Indonesia; advising and representing an Indonesian shipping company in connection with a facility agreement with

syndicated lenders; and advising shipping companies on foreign ownership restrictions and Indonesian cabotage laws.
